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JA Central Ontario Company Program Fun Icebreaker Ideas:

Feel free to mix and match these icebreakers based on the nature of your meetings (i.e., in-person or virtual) and the preferences of your participants. The goal is to create an engaging and enjoyable atmosphere that encourages interaction and collaboration between participants.

1. Show & Tell:

Participants share an interesting object they own and explain its significance. The items could be a favorite toy, a souvenir, a family photo, a book, a hobby-related item, or anything that holds personal significance.

3. Emoji Introductions:

Ask participants to introduce themselves using only emojis that represent their interests, hobbies, or personality.

4. Guess Who's Photo:

Participants share childhood photos, and others try to guess who's who.

5. Wellness Challenge:

Set a wellness goal for the week (e.g., drink more water, take short walks), and participants report their progress.

6. Harry Potter Houses:

Have participants sort themselves into Hogwarts houses and share why they identify with a particular house.

7. Botticelli:

One participant chooses a character or real person, and the others guess through yes or no questions what the other person has chosen.



8. Meme Creator:

Participants create memes related to a meeting topic or theme.

9. DIY Craft or Art Challenge:

Ask participants to create a quick doodle, digital art, or craft related to a specific theme.

10. Virtual Background Competition:

Participants show off creative virtual backgrounds related to a specific theme.

11. Guess That Song:

Play short clips of songs, and participants guess the song title and artist.

12. Mood Music:

Ask participants to share a song that describes their current mood or state of mind. (Please note, students should not share songs that include curse words or inappropriate topics)

13. Spotify Playlist Share:

Have participants share a song from their current favorite playlist and explain why they love it. (Please note, students should not share songs that include curse words or inappropriate topics)

14. Online Shopping Showdown:

Participants share one item they'd splurge on if they had unlimited money while shopping online.

15. Bucket List Sharing:

Have participants share one item from their personal or professional bucket list.

16. Fact or Fiction:

Participants share a surprising or little-known fact about themselves. Others guess if it's true or false.

17. Fun Discussion Question:

Ask a light-hearted question like "If you could have any superpower, what would it be and why?"

18. Mood barometer:

The classic "So, how are you folks doing?" usually gets you only a couple of reluctant answers. Ask your team how they are in a different way this time – try it with a [poll](#).
